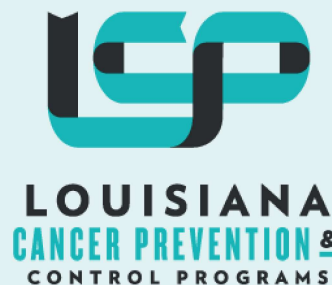
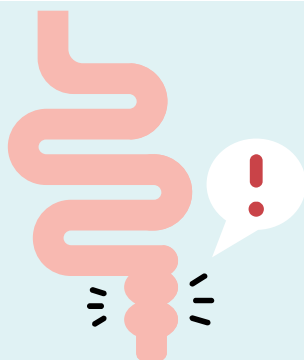


All About Colorectal Cancer

refers to cancer that starts in the colon or rectum.



It typically begins as a noncancerous growth called a

polyp

and develops slowly between a period of 10–15 years.

Colorectal cancer has a 90% survival rate

when detected early.

are 20% more likely to get colorectal cancer than white individuals.

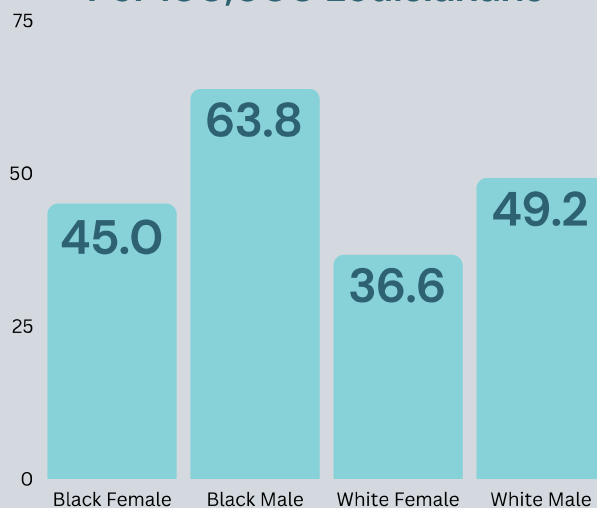


Louisiana
